PROHIBITION AGAINST VISIBLE EMISSIONS: Equipment must be operated in compliance with SDAPCD Rule 50, which prohibits visible emissions.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE: NASSCO BMP #102 outlines policies or reporting spills and medical emergencies.
